Job Description:

Part-time position available for an energetic, team-oriented Teen and Youth Services Librarian with a strong commitment to public service. This employee provides library service and programming for young adults ages 10-18. The candidate must be able to work on a flexible schedule as weekly scheduling is heavily dependent on library programming and will include regular evenings and weekends.

Benefits:

The position includes medical benefits, paid time off (PTO), and paid holidays. The employee may also opt in to the library's simple IRA retirement plan.

Responsibilities:

- Design, promote, execute, and evaluate:
 - Library programs and special events for youth ages 10-18
 - Outreach visits to local school district and community venues
- Collect statistics on programs and complete related reports
- Collaborate with partners in local school district, community, and other libraries
- Maintain public calendar for programming
- Coordinate and supervise teen volunteers
- Develop and maintain teen collections
- Manage Teen Services budget
- Maintain current knowledge of teen materials and trends
- Take part in professional development opportunities

Other Duties as Assigned:

- Collaborate with other staff on library projects and events
- Seek out and complete grant applications
- Assist with fundraising activities
- Perform other duties as assigned
